

### The Petroglyphs of Grapevine Canyon and Christmas Tree Pass

In the historically rich river valley of Bullhead City and Laughlin, there are hundreds of silently speaking rocks. These rocks are called petroglyphs. A petroglyph is a pecked or abraded image that is created by using a hand tool which was usually a rock. Since there was no written language, the primitive people needed a permanent system to record historical events, give directions on a trail, point to landmarks and rivers, and give other information that their tribe needed to communicate. That system is known as





petroglyphs, Indian writing or rock art. In the Southwest desert, there is a layer on the rock that is known as patina or more commonly known as desert varnish. Patina is a chemical reaction with the chemicals in the rock and the dust in the air. A layer over builds up thousands of years, and is quite simple to chip through.
